

Works involved engaging in community consultations and incorporating both public and council feedback into the design. ACE created a nature-themed playspace while also acknowledging Diamond Creek's gold mining history.

ACE's scope of works included:

- Full design of playspace, tram café landscape and labyrinth areas
- Supply and installation of all playground equipment
- Supply and installation of associated hard and soft landscaping

The focus of the design and construction was to make the playspace as accessible as possible and suitable for children of all abilities. This involved accessible and inclusive slides, flying fox, merry-go-round and the use of wheelchair-friendly soft fall made of recycled materials.

The use of natural timber enhances the natural character of play equipment and provides a tactile experience for sight impaired children. Built within a tight budget, existing timber logs were repurposed into play elements, seating logs and sculptural elements. The labyrinth is a simple non-intrusive contemplative pathway, nestled away from main paths, used for walking exercise and meditation.

Works were undertaken in a collaborative fashion with Council and local stakeholders, with ACE involved in the community consultation process to listen to residents and make them part of the decision-making process. Budget issues were resolved with open sharing of ideas and community engagement and donations from local community groups.

Ace Landscape Services were responsible for undertaking all works as head contractor. The works included over 7000m² of concrete pavements, numerous timber decks and boardwalks, 2 adventure playgrounds, custom shelters, a new turf oval for events and an array of planting throughout the site. Additionally, an electrical package valued at over \$1M was installed by Ace Electrical Infrastructure, which included over 80 new light poles, charging tables and Wi-Fi throughout the park.

Cultural and Environmental Sensitivity


We were faced with an existing site that had a large amount of cultural and environmental significance. Areas of significance also lined up with areas of major works. This meant construction methods had to be reconfigured to ensure culturally and environmentally sensitive locations experienced minimal impact during works.

Our team respectfully worked with the traditional custodians of the Wadawurrung land and with the environmental consultancy firm Biosis who assisted ACE with the archaelogical salvage works on site.

Cowes Jetty Triangle — Design and Construction Bass Coast Shire Council







As part of the Phillip Island Cowes Revitalisation Project, Ace Landscape Services undertook redevelopment of the Cowes Jetty Triangle, with the aim of revitalising the precinct, creating functional space for local markets and public events, and increasing access for all persons.

ACE's scope of works included:

- Complete concept design, function design and detailed design
- Obtaining planning permits and Council approvals
- Undertaking community liaison
- Design and installation of street and feature lighting
- Demolition of existing car park
- Construction of new retaining wall, feature paving and new pedestrian piazza
- DDA-compliant access to foreshore
- Passive lawn areas and garden beds planted with indigenous species suitable for local growing conditions

Council and Stakeholder Engagement

The design process was divided into 3 stages:

- Concept
- Function design
- Construction documentation

Early in the design process, ACE facilitated a day-long public information session for stakeholders – with Bass Coast Shire Council representatives and the architects (Tract) – on site at concept stage to receive feedback from interested parties as to what they wanted from the new layout.

Community feedback was taken on board and used to formulate the function design. This design was presented to Council by ACE and Tract, and feedback received from Council. A further meeting was arranged for sign-off on the function design by Councillors.

As part of a fast-track D&C, construction documentation was progressively received and works were commenced on site as documentation was finalised.

Suporting Local Communities

Local content was important to the community and ACE endeavoured to use local trades and suppliers where possible. As well as benefiting locals, the revitalisation of this precinct supports the growing number of visitors coming to Philip Island as a result of the major improvments to the nearby popular Penguin Parade.

Part of the D&C contract for Cowes Jetty Triangle was commisisoning and installing public art. ACE produced a brief on the requirements of the art piece and sought proposals from artists. The proposals were shortlisted and ACE presented these options to Council, who ultimately choose local artist Victoria Nelson's piece, *White Whale*. This stone-fabricated sculpture represents the increase in whale sightings around Philip Island.

ACE is proud to have been a part of this exciting project that has preserved the existing historial rotunda and improved pedestrian and vehicular access to the jetty.

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
